



Childcare Funding

for your two-year-old child



If you are receiving some form of additional government support, you may be entitled to 15 hours of government funded childcare for your 2 year old

Your 2 year old child could get up to 15 hours a week* government funded childcare if you are in receipt of one of the following forms of government support:

- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments
- Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit (or both), and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Your child is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- Your child has an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- Children who are Looked After by the Local Authority
- Children who have left care through an adoption order, residence order or special guardianship
- If you are a non-UK citizen who cannot claim benefits (no recourse to public funds), you may also be eligible



Eligible children will be able to receive the entitlement the term after they turn 2 (term beginning on or after 1st September, 1st April or 1st January)

*38 weeks per year, providers may ask for additional charges.
